Helena - The Montana Department of Revenue would like to remind owners of real and personal property about these upcoming important deadlines:

April 15

· Property Tax Assistance Program

The Property Tax Assistance Program (PTAP) provides property tax relief to anyone who meets the qualifications and there is no age restriction. To qualify for this program, taxpayers must own and occupy their home as their primary residence and meet the income requirements which range up to \$23,385 for a single person and up to \$31,181 for households with more than one owner occupant. Applications are due by April 15 for Tax Year 2022.

· Montana Disabled Veteran Property Tax Relief

Montana Disabled Veteran (MDV) Property Tax Relief helps qualifying 100 percent disabled veterans and their surviving spouses

Similar to PTAP, taxpayers must own and occupy their home as their primary residence and meet the income requirements, which range up from \$54,067 for a single person, \$62,385 for a married couple, to \$47,136 for a surviving spouse. Applications are due by April 15 for Tax Year 2022.

The FLL team also qualified for the North Dakota State FLL Robotics Competition in Grand Forks.

Alexander also has a second team called Alexander Legendary Legos. That team is made up of students in grades 6-8. There are 7 students on that team. They won the Innovation Project

Award at the Williston Regional competition.

The Innovation Project Award goes to the team who utilizes diverse resources for their Innovation Project to help them gain a comprehensive understanding of their problem; has a creative, well-researched solution; and effectively communicates their findings to judges and the community.

Alexander Public Schools started the FLL program in 2019. It is made up of students in 4th and 5th grade and introduces students to engineering challenges by building LE-

"Each year, they are given a new robot challenge and they have to come up with a solution for the innovation project theme. This year's theme deals with cargo and transportation,"

explained Rizzo.



It became apparent to Garrett, that between upland birds, waterfowl, big game and fishing, there were still not enough hunting and fishing seasons; so he taught himself to trap. In addition to work, hunting and fishing, he ran a trap line; sampling the meat from virtually every animal he trapped (beaver anyone).

In the past year, he trained his two newest hunting partners, Lilo and Piper who flushed pheasants and fetched geese until exhaustion for Garrett.

Garrett was preceded in death by his grandmother Patricia Larson; his father Mark Basta and all his maternal and paternal great grandparents.

Gummy Games Softball Camp Held Feb. 20-21

On Feb. 20, 21 girls took part in something new to the softball world, the world's first Gummy Games Softball Camp at the Sidney High School gym.



MT Dept. of Revenue: Keep **Your Address Current**

Helena - The Montana Department of Revenue has an important message to income tax filers: Keep your mailing address current with the department.

This is especially true for anyone filing a Montana income tax return for the first time. That's because the department sends refunds to first-time filers only as paper checks – not by direct deposit – due to our security measures to combat fraud. And, the Post Office will not forward your refund check to your new address.

That means that if the department has an incorrect address, your refund could be delayed.

Other taxpayers who change their address should also keep the department updated, because the department may attempt to contact you by mail if there are questions about

Changing your address with the Montana Department of Revenue is easy. You can download a change-of-address form at MTRevenue.gov or request one from our Call Center at 406-444-6900.

Montanans who haven't filed state returns in three years or more will also receive any refund on a paper check.

Remember, it could take up to 90 days to receive your refund. You can check the status of yours in our TransAction Portal at https://tap.dor.mt.gov.

How Can Avoid Probate?

There seems to be a universal agreement that people want to avoid probate. When asked why Montanans say because of the probate fees. True, probate fees in the past were calculated on the value of the estate that passed through probate. If you had a million dollar piece of property the fee was based on that value. Now probate fees are to be "reasonable." In other words how much time did it take the attorney to file the necessary papers to have the property transferred to the heirs, regardless if the person died with or without a will.

Are you still wondering if there is a way to avoid probate? The answer to this question thanks to the Montana legislature is yes! They have provided tools for Montanans to pass different types of property at death. By doing some things now, you can set up many of your financial assets to help your heirs avoid probate and save

In Montana, various contractual arrangements are recognized, and these transfers take effect upon a person's death. Some of these arrangements could be beneficiary designations on an insurance policy and pensions plan, along with many others.

With a Payable on Death (POD) designation, you are able to name the beneficiary of your checking, savings, and other accounts. With the POD, you still keep control of your money during your lifetime. The beneficiary of these accounts does not have ownership over these accounts until you die then; the balance of these accounts passes to the POD beneficiary. If you decide you want to change your POD beneficiary, you can fill out a new form with your bank or credit union. Your POD form should also be reviewed periodically and updated as circumstances change (birth, marriage, death, etc.).

A Transfer on Death Registration (TOD) is similar to POD. However, it is used to designate beneficiaries of stocks, mutual funds, and

bonds. The TOD beneficiary does not have ownership rights over your funds while you are alive. Upon your death, these securities are transferred to your designated beneficiary. You can also change who your beneficiary is by filling out a new form. Upon your death, the beneficiary of these accounts has the option keeping, or selling them.

Both the POD and TOD are ways to transfer accounts or funds to a beneficiary without going through the probate process. Even though probate can be avoided with these contractual arrangements,

the assets passed to beneficiaries are still subject to creditors claims against the deceased's estate. Planning ahead can help your heirs avoid the probate process helping save the estate mon-






The Alexander Comets FTC Robotics Team #9963 started off the year with what has become the norm for the program, a successful season.

On Jan. 7, the team traveled to Fargo to compete against 12 teams and won the 1st place Connect Award, the 2nd place Inspire award and the 2nd place Motivate award.

The team also competed at the Dakota Adventist Academy Bismarck Regional competition, competing against 18 teams, and taking home the 1st place Motivate award and the 3rd place Innovate award.

At the FTC State Championship on Feb. 5, 12 robotics teams competed at the Bismarck Career Academy and the Alexander Public School's robotics team won the 1st place Motivate award, 1st Place Promote Award, 2nd place Inspire Award, 2nd Place Think Award, 2nd Place Connect Award, and the Finalist Alliance 1st team selected Award.

The team hopes to advance to other competitions including a Maryland Tec Invitational. The FTC team will apply to attend the MTI at the Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Laboratory, Laurel, MD, on June 24-26.

"This competition is all about the Robot," added Alexander Robotics Team mentor/coach, Cathy White.

The team is also looking to return to the National Advocacy Conference, Washington, DC, in June.

"This event is for the purpose of advocating for STEM and Robotics in Education across the country. We will specifically be speaking to our own ND Legislators about the importance of STEM and Robotics in education and building the foundation of skills students will need to be successful in the future," explained White.

"The FTC team is always looking for mentors from the engineering and technology world. We are also looking for additional sponsors for our team and the events we would like to participate in."

The team hosted a scrimmage, inviting teams from Tioga, Minot, and Bismarck to come to Alexander and work together to show Gracious Professionalism.

"Answering questions and helping each other is how FTC teams work together," said White.

On March 5, the team is hosting an additional event this year called a Nerf Battle. It is a fundraising event that wiii de open to the school and public in the Alexander Public School gymnasium. There will be teams formed, set match times, practice round, and free-for-alls. The cost for the event is \$5 per person or \$30 for a team of seven. Concessions will be available to purchase throughout the day.

This event is a fundraiser to help support the FTC program - the proceeds will be split with a local kindergarten student that was diagnosed with leukemia in August 2021.

Onesti Krieger is an abstract painter, working mostly in oils and acrylics.







- Don't count on receiving a refund by a certain date. Some refunds are required to be held until after late February.
- Track your refund on IRS.gov or the IRS mobile app,
- All IRS Taxpayer Assistance Centers (TACs) are by appointment only. Don't wait until it's too late to ask questions! However, Most questions can be resolved on the IRS.gov website without visiting a TAC.
- There are tools, filing options and other services and resources available on www.IRS.gov.

Consumer Alerts on Tax Scams Note that the IRS will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if
- you owe any taxes. Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other lawenforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.
- Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you
- · Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.




