Fairview Fire Emergency Preparedness Gavilon Grain Facility

On April 30, 2015, an emergency preparedness drill was conducted at the Gavilon Grain facility in Fairview, MT, in conjunction with the Fairview Volunteer Fire Department. A scenario was developed where a Gavilon employee entered a large grain bin in order to sweep and clean the structure. It was simulated that the employee either had a medical emergency or was overcome by some type of atmospheric condition. At 4:41 p.m., the location simulated an emergency 911 call to local first responders. Members of

the Fairview Volunteer Fire Department and the local ambulance service arrived on site and quickly assessed the situation with local Gavilon management. Fire fighters ensured grain handling equipment was powered off and checked the atmosphere inside the grain bin with testing monitors to make sure conditions were safe for fire department personnel to enter. Fire fighters quickly placed the Gavilon employee on a back board and moved him out of the bin through a small side hatch.

Once outside, EMTs medically assessed the employee. At 5:15 p.m. the drill was concluded with a tour of

the facility in order to orient the fire department to the layout of the facility. Later in the evening, the emergency responders and Gavilon employees met for dinner and an after-action review to discuss lessons learned through the drill. Stuart Beckman, Regional Operations Manager for Gavilon's north region, was on site to evaluate the drill and commented, "The local fire department did an outstanding job. They responded quickly and appropriately for the mock incident that occurred. Many of the firefighters were area farmers and were knowledgeable about grain bin and confined space entry procedures."

Sidney Memorial Day Activities

The Flags of Honor Committee, along with volunteers from the Sidney Lions Club and other volunteers, will post 130 flags around Veterans Park beginning at 6:00 a.m. Flags posted will begin with "Ted Goss" and end at "John Miller".

People carrying flags in that group can take the flag and go to the VFW Club beginning at 10:00. People wanting flags from the Flags of Honor room must sign out the flag before taking it. These can be carried on a pole or folded. The parade will begin at 11:00 at the VFW Club, head west to

Central Avenue, then go south on Central Avenue to Veterans Park where they must repost their flag or refold, as the case may be. All checked out flags must be in their proper shelf space before the program begins.

Immediately following the program will be a pot luck picnic at the park. The VFW and Ladies Auxiliary VFW will provide hot dogs, beans, chips, and buns. Plates, napkins, and silverware will also be provided. Participants must provide their own drinks and other food to coincide with the pot luck meal.

Flag etiquette states that

when a parade is held with American Flags, spectators are to salute the first flags of the parade as they pass by, which will be let by the VFW Post and colors. They are to stand at attention throughout the remaining parade of flags.

The flags will remain posted in the park throughout the major part of the day. Weather plays an important role in the decision making, but usually the flags begin to come down about 3:30 p.m. They will all have to be refolded and put back in their proper location in the Flags of Honor room.

The Flags of Honor program is a community volun-

teer program which currently houses 625 casket flags. Last year the decision was made to "retire" flags from veterans who served in the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, and WW1. These flags are on display in the room, but will no longer be removed for the purpose of flying. Funds provided for this program are strictly from donations. Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) Workshop

Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States, with one suicide occurring every 17 minutes. Montana has the highest suicide rate in the nation, with Eastern Montana being higher than the State average. In an effort to prevent these tragic events, District II Alcohol and Drug Program is working to help communities develop stronger suicide prevention plans and increase the number of trained caregivers in the region to prevent suicide and help those in crisis.

District II will provide community members with training in suicide first aid skills using the ASIST method. Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) will provide participants with the necessary attitudes, knowledge and skills to recognize persons at risk and to undertake appropriate management or referral of a person who is at risk of suicide. Suicide and non-fatal suicidal behaviors, ranging from gestures to suicide attempts, are far more common than most people realize. Almost everyone will come into contact with suicidal behaviors in some significant way during their lifetime. Many people are trained to administer first aid to someone having a heart attack, but very few people know emergency first aid for preventing suicide.

The ASIST workshop will deal directly with attitudes about suicide prevention. On the first day of the training, participants will learn how to recognize those persons who might be at risk by identifying a number of different signs and indicators. Some of the major warning signs of suicide include sudden changes in behavior or personality, previous suicide attempts, suicidal statements which express a desire or intention to die, and feelings of depression, helplessness, hopelessness, isolation, and loss. One of the most important first aid skills to have is the ability to ask directly about the suicide intentions of someone you are worried about. Skill development exercises and community networking activities will take up the entire second day of the workshop.

The ASIST workshop will be held from 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. June 8th and 9th in Sidney at the Sidney Assembly of God Church at 414 E. Main Street. There is no cost for the workshop and participants will receive books, materials, breakfast and refreshments for both days. Continuing education credits will be available. Training will be facilitated by certified ASIST Trainers, Tim Anderson, Clinical Director for District II Alcohol & Drug Program and Tara Hubing, Counselor for Circle Public Schools. 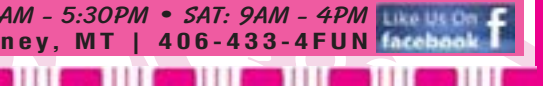

'Gardening Through The Ages' Exhibit Is Open For Viewing At The Confluence Center



For approximately 900 years people have farmed what is now North Dakota.

This display shows the progression of gardening tools that have been used throughout the years.

In addition to their permanent display, as of May 1st the Confluence Center got a new temporary display which only happens about once every two years. 'Gardening through the Ages' is an interesting look at the history and progression

gardens and gardeners have had in this area.

The exhibit takes guests through the trials, errors, and successes of early gardeners who tended their gardens through extreme weather, hailstorms, short growing seasons, early frost, pests, and drought.

For the Mandan and Hidatsa tribes, the garden was a sacred spot and vegetables were planted in a specific order from the perimeter in. For military forts, a garden was another means to keep soldiers fit, and prayers and blessings were regularly offered by many different cultures. Whatever purposes a garden had, all were second to it being a primary food source throughout harsh winters. A devastated garden could mean disease and death with scurvy being an issue especially among military forts. Treatment for the disease which causes severe joint pain, bruising to the legs and feet, loss of teeth, and even death was acid found in limes, lemons, and vinegar.

Even if Mother Nature appeared to be on the gardener's side, pests still had to be dealt with to prevent a ruined harvest. A variety of methods were used such as thorny buffalo berry fences, traps, guns, bows and arrows.

During WWI and WWII,

gardening was promoted as a patriotic act, encouraging civilians to grow their own produce in an attempt to have enough supplies for armed forces.

The display offers many examples of evolved gardening and preserving methods and shows a detailed history of the significant role vegetable gardens have played throughout the years.

The State Historical Society of North Dakota developed and covered the costs of the exhibit and the subject of each exhibit is determined by either the Historical Curators or by public request. The State Historical Society of North Dakota provides exhibits to museums throughout the state either by 'traveling trunks', which are smaller displays or entire room exhibits such as the one at the Confluence Center. There is a \$5.00 charge for adults and a \$2.50 charge for ages 5 to 16 year olds which allows for a tour through the Confluence Center as well as a tour of Fort Buford. The public is invited to stop by from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm Central Time and 9:00 am to 6:00 pm Central Time from Memorial Day until Labor Day. It is located 22 miles southwest of Williston, ND off highways 1804 and 58; for more information visit them online at history.nd.gov.

Re-Tree Richland County Held May 16th

 The Re-Tree Richland County workshop was held Saturday, May 16 at the Sidney Country Club with approximately 40 people in attendance. This is the second year the workshop was held under the direction of Stephanie Ridl, City Parks Superintendent, certified arborist, and Richland County Tree Board Secretary along with the Richland County Tree Board. In 2014 the workshop was open to anyone, however only those within city limits were provided with trees to plant; the interest and success of last year's workshop allowed for trees to be provided county wide in 2015.

Topics covered included proper planting and pruning techniques: planting trees in a space adequate for their mature height and width to prevent topping, the difference between pruning fruit bearing and non-fruit bearing trees, preparing roots prior to planting, and that cuts should be made flush against the tree allowing water to flow over it rather than settle in it, making the tree susceptible to decay and disease.

Tim Fine from the MSU Extension Office and member of the Richland County Tree Board discussed parasites in terms of preparation and prevention. With Dutch Elm Disease having such an impact on

the tree population and Emerald Ash Borer moving towards the area, the need to diversify tree species is a specific goal of Ridl's ultimately having one species of trees make up no more than 10% of the Sidney canopy.

"It's not so much a matter of if Emerald Ash Borer will affect the Ash tree population here, but when it will affect the Ash tree population," Ridl said on Saturday, explaining that unlike Dutch Elm Disease which only infected American Elms, Emerald Ash Borer will infect all species of Ash trees.

Diseases such as black knot and fire blight, which effect fruit bearing trees, were covered in terms of pruning

as a means of disease control and how to disinfect pruning tools using Lysol, rubbing alcohol, or a bleach solution.

Those in attendance took a tour of the golf course for some hands-on learning and 28 trees were sent home with residents to be planted in Richland County.

Ridl would like to thank the Richland County Tree Board, the cities of Sidney and Fairview, Charmaine Wehmhoefer from MDU in Bismark, ND, Jason Lamb and the Sidney Country Club staff, and Pepsi and Blue Rock for making the Re-Tree Richland County workshop possible.

 Fifteen year old Fairview sophomore Dean Risinger is participating in his seventh year of the Special Olympics, receiving a gold medal for the 100 meter run, softball throw, and bowling. He is currently at the State Games in Missoula, MT and this is his third year being eligible for the Norbie Challenge, which is based on 100 plus ticket sales. Risinger's mother Michelle Judd notes that without the support of friends, family, and area businesses he would not make the sales every year to have the chance to participate in the Norbie Challenge

The Law Enforcement Torch Run was May 4th and began at the North Dakota/

Montana border in Fairview and continued to Sidney, with the help of the Fairview and Sidney police departments who organize the event. Risinger completed four miles on his bike alongside 54 other participants. The Law Enforcement Torch Run is an event that takes place all over the state of Montana.

Judd was involved with the Special Olympics when she was attending high school in Sidney and talks about the benefits of being involved.

"I thinks it's a great way to keep Dean active and it's good for him to be involved in sports with other kids. As parents we can get together and discuss things you wouldn't discuss with parents who don't have

kids with special needs."

The State Games in Missoula has health stations where teeth and hearing can be checked as well, but for Risinger it is the dance, barbeque, and carnival that he's looking forward to. Every participant is required to have seven hours of training per sport and coaches must attend all events with one coach for every four participants; Judd has completed the coach's training online.

The money raised through sponsors of the Law Enforcement Torch Run funds regional and state games and \$4 of every \$5 in MTN Chevy ticket sales for the Norbie Challenge goes back into the community to help with traveling and food

expenses for those who participate in the Special Olympics.

Judd moved back to the area in 2005 and commented, "Fairview has been awesome and welcomed Dean. The community and school is always there to watch the Torch Run and show their support and I appreciate those that come out to run. Dean puts a smile on your face; he's just an awesome kid."

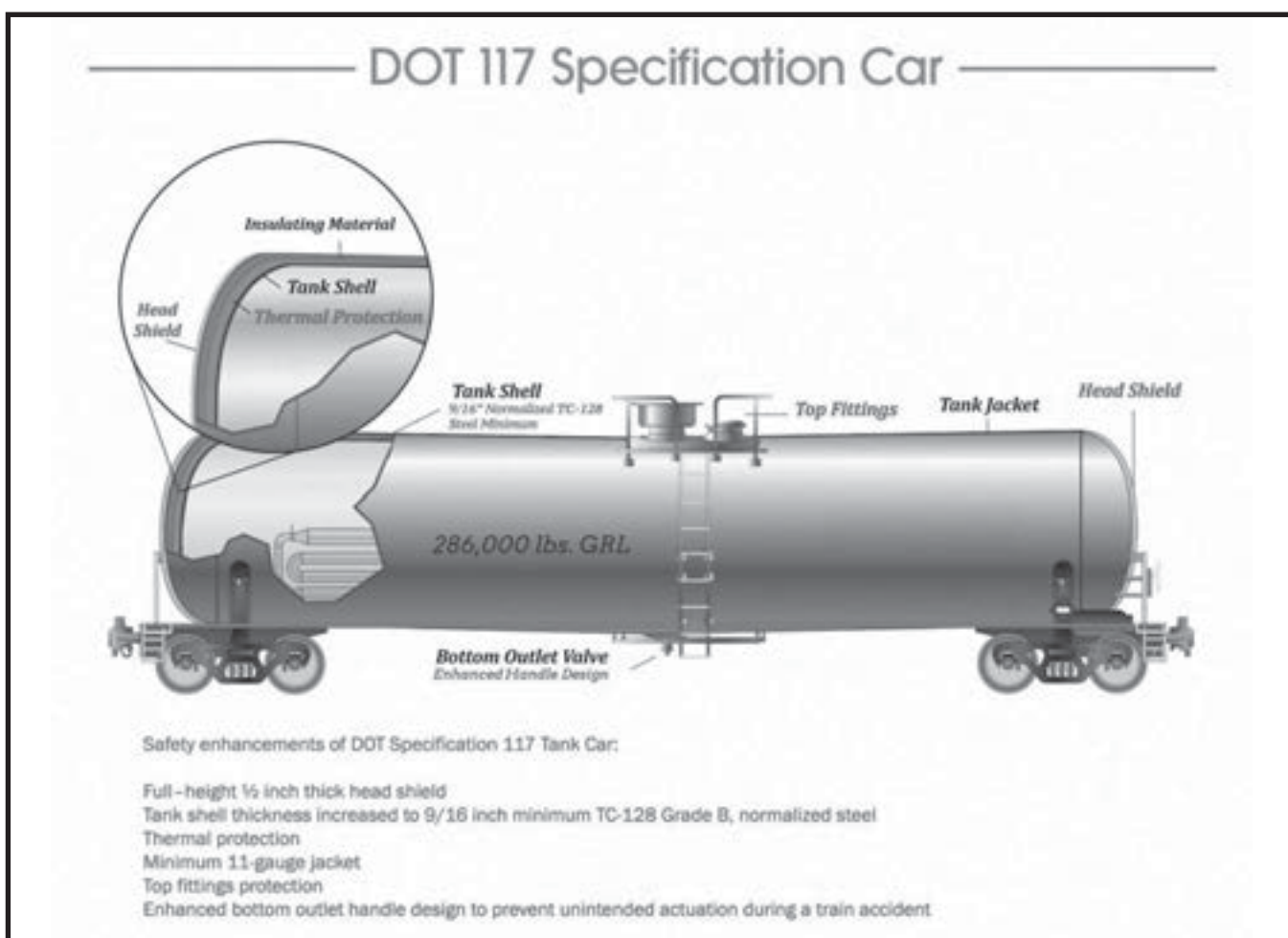

DOT Announces Final Rule For Transporting Crude By Rail

 WASHINGTON – On May 1, U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx announced a final rule for transporting crude by rail. The rule focuses on safety improvements that are designed to prevent accidents, mitigate consequences in the event of an accident, and support emergency response.

The rule does the following: Unveils a new, enhanced tank car standard and an aggressive, risk-based retrofitting schedule for older tank cars carrying crude oil and ethanol; Requires a new braking standard for certain trains that will offer a superior level of safety by potentially reducing the severity of an accident, and the "pile-up effect"; Designates new operational protocols for trains transporting large volumes of flammable liquids, such as routing requirements, speed restrictions, and information for local government agencies; and provides new sampling and testing requirements to improve classification of energy products placed into transport.

Canada joins the US in developing a harmonized solution for safety. Secretary



Anthony Foxx was joined by Canada's Minister of Transport, Lisa Raitt, to announce Canada's new tank car stan-

dards, which align with the U.S. standard.

"Safety has been our top priority at every step in

the process for finalizing this rule, which is a significant improvement over the current regulations and requirements

and will make transporting flammable liquids safer," said U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx. "Our close

collaboration with Canada on new tank car standards is recognition that the trains moving unprecedented amounts of crude by rail are not U.S. or Canadian tank cars – they are part of a North American fleet and a shared safety challenge."

"This stronger, safer, more robust tank car will protect communities on both sides of our shared border," said Minister Raitt. "Through strong collaboration we have developed a harmonized solution for North America's tank car fleet. I am hopeful that this kind of cooperation will be a model for future Canada-U.S. partnership on transportation issues."

US DOT states that other federal agencies are also pursuing strategies to improve safety.


